

Scientific & Administrative Staff Mobility

What's it about?

In 2017 SUNY Upstate Medical University (SUNY-UMU) joined the 'International Network on Diabetes and Depression (IN2D)', which is coordinated by Technische Universität Dresden (TU Dresden), Germany. The network aims to conduct leading-edge international health and medical research, initiate joint funding programs, promote staff and student mobility exchanges, engage and enable industry and health workforce partnerships, to support proof of concept projects, local business opportunities and health professional educational opportunities.

To promote collaborative partnerships and joint projects between SUNY-UMU and TU Dresden, we are offering **financial and organizational support for long-term stays in Dresden for scientific, professional and cultural exchange.**

Financial support will be available for **time periods** from **15 days** up to **6 months**.

Who is eligible?

- SUNY Upstate Medical University employed academic staff working on diabetes and/or depression research projects
- Professional staff employed by SUNY-UMU who will provide support to promote collaborative partnerships, joint projects between TU Dresden and SUNY-UMU

Possible aims of a proposed stay abroad:

- development of new or continuation of ongoing projects in the field of diabetes and/or depression
- preparation of applications for third-party funds for joint projects
- Initiation of joint projects within the partnership, e.g. in research support, fundraising, student & staff exchange, etc.
- professional and cultural exchange on administrative level, e.g. via job shadowing

How much funding will I get?

EUR 89 per day for up to 22 days **or EUR 2000** per month to cover living expenses **plus EUR 700** once for travel costs

- Letter of motivation/project outline (short description of your current position, proposed outcomes, expected benefit from the stay, proposed schedule for the planned stay, previous

connections to the visited facility and in case of ongoing projects specification of thesis)

- Declaration of consent signed by your Supervisor
- Letter of invitation of the corresponding partner at TU Dresden
